## Council Meeting – October 19, 2021

- A Public Meeting was held regarding a Housekeeping Amendment to the Comprehensive Zoning By-Law to align the zoning of Artisan Ridge Phase 2 to Artisan Ridge Phase 1.
- Joey Hewitt, Thorold Representative on the Joint Accessibility Advisory Committee provided a presentation and update on accessibility mandates within the City of Thorold.
- Council received a presentation from the Niagara Industrial Association, showcasing the importance of manufacturing in our area and how they can be a resource for the community.
- A resolution was passed to allow for minor variance applications for Rolling Meadows Phase 15.
- Rolling Meadows Phases 14 and 16 OPA, ZBA and Draft Plan were approved, except for Item 6. A report will come to council later this year with more information on this item.
- City initiated housekeeping amendment to Zoning Bylaw 2140(97) related to Artisan Ridge Subdivision was approved.
