Program Descriptions

Public Skate

Public skate is a great opportunity to get out with friends and family for some fun exercise. Participants can lace up their skates and enjoy an hour and a half of skating in a controlled environment. Skate patrol staff will monitor any unsafe behavior. Additional rules are posted at each skate.

We strongly recommend CSA approved skate helmets are worn at all times

Adult Skate

Adult Skate is a program designed for adults 18+ to come out and get some exercise and practice their skating skills. Participants are expected to skate in a respectful and controlled manner. No hockey equipment is permitted on the ice. CSA approved helmets are recommended for all participants. All abilities welcome!

Senior Skate

Senior Skate is open to anyone 55 or over. This is a great program for anyone who wants to socialize and enjoy a modified skating environment. Additional guidelines for this skate are shared with participants upon registration. Coffee and treats are provided by several dedicated volunteers.

Free Tiny Tots

Tiny tots is a free skate that allows parents and guardians to practice skating skills with young children below age 6. Older siblings may join in the fun, but must be skating beside a guardian at all times in a safe manner. A maximum of 3 guardians to one child is permitted on the ice at any time. Families must have a minimum of one child under the age of 6 to attend. This is the only skate where skate aids are permitted. No sticks or pucks allowed. CSA approved helmets are recommended for all participants.

Stick & Puck

Stick and Puck is a non-competitive, non-contact skate designed to allow young skaters the opportunity to practice their stick handling skills in a safe environment. There are two age divisions designed to cater to participant skills and development:

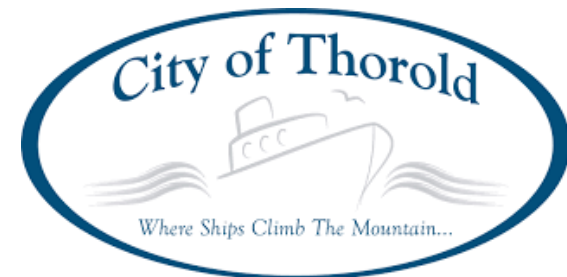
Over 12 (13-17): Parental supervision is required, however parents can actively supervise off ice. Each parent/ guardian can supervise up to four participants

Under 12: (6-12): On ice parental supervision is required. Each parent/or guardian can supervise up to two participants.

Participants must wear full equipment with CSA approved helmet. It is up to parents/ guardians to monitor and address any behavior issues. This program is not supervised by staff.
